70/26 AGENDA ITEM 6: CDC REPORT CLLR JOHN CROSS CDC Matters July 2026 On Saturday 13th June, I went to Graffham Empire Hall to watch a film with a large number of the village's residents. The event was organised by Ginny Kingsmill and was a film highlighting a conference that was held in Westminster Conference Hall, opposite the Palace of Westminster. The film entitled the National Emergency Briefing, presented by Chris Packham, was a conference attended by political, business, sport, culture and faith leaders. The speakers were the leading experts not only on climate change, but economists, ex-military, and food and health experts. I would urge everyone to watch this presentation, its roughly 50 minutes long and a sobering state of where we are as a nation. It also is reflective and reaches out and demonstrates what we can do as citizens, this is not a problem leaders or someone else should be dealing with on our behalf, although that is true too, but all of us play apart. I won't say anymore, but I applaud Ginny and the residents of Graffham for getting together and watching this, at times uncomfortable viewing. If any other village or resident group wish to organise a public viewing, I would be happy to help in anyway. On a lighter note, on Friday 12th of June, I went to a Question and Answer session at Priory Park in Chichester, organised by the Priory Park Society to talk about the Cricket Pavilion that the District Council is about to demolish and rebuild. Since the early 1980s the building has been in a poor state and more recently unfit for the reality of men and women's cricket teams playing and using the same building. The new building will have unisex facilities, the old pavilion only had mens toilets, and will have separate changing rooms for the umpires, again in the past it was assumed that the umpire was the same sex as the players, that's not the case in today's game. The money for this re-build comes from S106 and CIL funding, these are monies that are gathered by the Council from developers to be spent on the community, and the rest of the money comes from the Council's Asset Replacement Budget (ARB). The District Council continues to invest and update the facilities across the district, nearer to home the Petworth Public Toilets will be refurbished at the end of this year. Getting back to the Cricket Pavilion, I had not realised that Chichester District really was the place where cricket as a game was established. I would be really interested to hear from residents about 18 or 19th century local connections to cricket, I am sure there is a rich story to be told here. John Cross was emailed by the Village Shop regarding funding for solar panels. CIL funding was mentioned but the shop has not approached the Parish Council. Road closures agreed different timings to avoid traffic issues around the Goodwood Revival. Business Grants – local start up grants and growth funds are available. Planning Committee meeting powers are being removed from planning committees such as red carding. This makes it more important for Parish Councils to make their comments on applications. Cllr Major has been consulting all trustees and stakeholders and will report on findings. Parish Council to consider whether the time has come to consider paid assistance for village administration, along with appropriate levels of automation for bookings and invoicing. Cllr Charlesworth suggested a different way to manage the administration of the hall, having a paid person to do the accounting and booking system. It was suggested by Cllr Charlesworth to speak to the users of the hall to try to find a Chair for the committee and suggested a village meeting with them to discuss the situation. Cllr Major explained that there has been a design statement around 30 years ago. Cllr Longman suggested Trevor Leggo may be of some help with this and stated that it must carry weight in planning. iv) KMGF grant requests from: i. The Food Bank – a request to donate again on the grounds that some Graffham residents use the food bank (last donation made in December 25). Cllr Major felt that people could personally donate but did not feel that it was appropriate for the Parish Council or KMGF to donate. It was felt that it was not transparent enough where the money would be going. ii. Graffham School – a request to donate again to support assisted learning needs. Length of commitment discussed and also the students that are in need. A majority agreed to donate £2500. iii. Selham Churchyard (From GPC not KMGF). GPC has in the past given a grant to Selham church for churchyard maintenance. They have requested that this be reinstated (£300 a year). The council RESOLVED to donate £2500 from KMGF to Graffham School and £300 from Parish Council VAT reclaim reserves for Selham Churchyard. v) Car park extension grant The options for grants were explained, also the suggested surface. Cllr Major questioned the drainage. It was resolved to apply for the 50% grant. vi) Re- tender the garden maintenance contract This was not discussed.
